Set out below is information for the use of Conference Attendees in reporting CPD credits under the MCPD Regimes in British Columbia, Ontario and Québec for attendance at programs delivered by Delee Fromm Consulting.

For Ontario-called Lawyers (Law Society of Upper Canada)
